Teck is committed to the safe and environmentally responsible management of tailings facilities throughout the mining life cycle to protect the health and safety of people, the environment, and Communities of Interest.

Teck is committed to the implementation of the Global Industry Standard on Tailings Management (GISTM) and protocols established by the International Council on Mining and Metals (ICMM) and the Mining Association of Canada (MAC). We manage our tailings facilities responsibly throughout the mining life cycle, including planning, design, construction, operation, and closure.

As a company, we are committed to:

- •Managing tailings facilities in a manner that addresses risks and reduces potential long term-impacts to the environment and surrounding communities, and includes consideration of climate change.
- •Meaningful engagement with Communities of Interest in a manner that respects human rights and Indigenous rights, including incorporating a local and Indigenous knowledge base into decision making.
- •Management and decision-making practices that incorporate Best Available Practices and Technologies, where practicable.

- •Development of emergency response plans and implementation of mechanisms for post-incident recovery in collaboration with our Communities of Interest.
- •Maintaining our Management System to identify and implement regulatory requirements, objectives, training and competency requirements, resourcing allocation and risk management.
- •Governance processes including internal and external audits, independent reviews, and assurance activities with the intent of continuous improvement in performance and safety.
- •Transparent disclosure of information on our tailings facilities and their performance in a timely manner.

An Accountable Executive is responsible for the governance of tailings and for providing updates to the Teck Board of Directors. Implementation of this Policy is overseen by Teck Senior Management.
