

Teck is committed to the implementation of the Global Industry Standard on Tailings Management (GISTM) and industry-leading protocols established by the International Council on Mining and Metals (ICMM) and the Mining Association of Canada (MAC). We manage our tailings facilities sustainably throughout the mining life cycle, including planning, design, construction, operation, and closure.

As a company, we are committed to:

- Managing tailings facilities in a manner that addresses risks, minimizes liabilities and reduces potential long term-impacts to the environment and surrounding communities, and includes consideration of climate change.
- Meaningful engagement with Communities of Interest in a manner that respects human rights in accordance with the United Nations Guiding Principles.
- Proactively engaging with Communities of Interest on the design, management, and review of the tailings facility, and incorporating a local knowledge base into decision making processes.

- Incorporation of Best Available Practices and Technologies in our management of tailings facilities.
- Development of emergency response plans and implementation of mechanisms for post-incident recovery in collaboration with our Communities of Interest.
- Maintaining our Management System to identify and implement regulatory requirements, objectives, training and competency requirements, resourcing allocation and risk management.
- Governance processes including internal and external audits, independent reviews, and assurance activities with the intent of continuous improvement in performance and safety.
- Transparent disclosure of information on our tailings facilities and their performance in a timely manner.

An Accountable Executive is responsible for the governance of tailings and for providing updates to the Teck Board of Directors. Implementation of this Policy is overseen by Teck Senior Management.
