Engaging with Our Community – Fall 2020

What We Heard:

In fall 2020, we shared information about Teck Trail Operations and gathered feedback from the community. The community engagement process was designed to give local residents and organizations an opportunity to hear from the Trail Operations team directly and provide input on a number of topics, including items the community expressed interest in learning more about during our fall 2019 engagement.

What We Heard from Our Community



Participants wanted to learn more about **employment and training at Trail Operations** in particular in terms of **diversity, equality and inclusion**.



Participants were interested in discussing Trail Operation's **procurement**, including expanding source feeds and products, Red Dog mine's lifespan and local ore exploration.



Participants were interested in learning about the **sustainability initiatives** underway at Trail Operations, and noted Teck and Trail Operations should **continue to do more to combat climate change and reduce greenhouse gas emissions** from extraction to transportation, and smelting and refining.



Participants discussed **Trail Operations' response to the COVID-19 pandemic**, most community members noting Teck did **commendable work protecting employees** and suggested sharing best practices with other organizations in the community.
